It has been a hectic and hugely enjoyable first fortnight back at The Grange.

We had already welcomed many of the new Year 7s at the Transition Summer School at the end of July and it was wonderful to see the new cohort of pupils lined up smartly in their new uniforms at the start of the Autumn term.

It has been a delight, too to see the full range of sports activities in full flow on our magnificent playing fields and sports facilities after school every day of the past fortnight. I particularly enjoyed the football trials for Year 7 pupils. Two boys and two girls in Year 7 are high-flyers with the Academy at Watford FC, which hopefully bodes well for the season ahead. If your child is selected to represent the school in any sport, we do appreciate your full parental support and cooperation in making them available for matches and training.

It was excellent to see the Year 10s kick off their season with a resounding 8-1 win away at Westfield and the Year 9s also performed well in a 7-2 victory over Westfield.

Covid continues to cast a shadow, but, while we remain vigilant as well as vaccinated in increasing numbers, hopefully that shadow is diminishing. All pupils have now been lateral flow-tested, twice since returning and we would ask everyone to continue to use the free packs to test at home twice a week.

Year 12 will be having an instructional morning on university applications next week and Year 13 are busily completing their UCAS applications. They will be hoping to follow in the footsteps of last year's leavers, who netted a record haul of 11 places to Russell Group Universities this summer.

Value-added at A level was again in very positive territory, with a record number of A-B grades (60%). The recent success of our Brilliant Club students is a very promising indicator of more good things to come, too.

Individual student photos took place this week at the academy and the external photography company have asked us to extend their sincere thanks to all of the students. Our visitors were impressed by the politeness and courtesy that students in every year group displayed and extended to the photographers. OPEN EVENING

On Thursday 23 September, we will be holding our Open Evening when we will be welcoming prospective students and their parents to the academy, from 5.00pm to 7.30pm.

To enable staff to prepare for the evening, the academy will close early to students on that day. Students will be dismissed at 12.30pm at the end of lesson 4. We ask that parents make appropriate arrangements to accommodate this early finish. Students who are entitled to free school meals will be able to use this allowance at break time.

SIXTH FORM NEWS

The University of Lincoln will be visiting the Sixth Form next week to run a series of workshops supporting all aspects of Post 16. They aim to cover aspects from how best to approach Post 16 studies to making decisions about university courses, while offering tips to support students with this. Our Year 12 students will enjoy a presentation on 'Making the most of Post 16' and in smaller groups will take part in practical workshops on 'Time Management and Study Skills'. Meanwhile, our Year 13 students will be supported in the university applications process as well as getting specific guidance on how to write their all-important personal statements. We are looking forward to welcoming the University of Lincoln and the benefits the sessions will provide our students.

THE BRILLIANT CLUB

Congratulations to the 12 students in Year 11 who completed The Scholars Programme at the end of last year. The students learnt all about aerospace composites with a University PhD student who is specialising in this field and carrying out extensive research. They attended an online launch event with the University of Manchester, which included a study skills session, virtual tour of the campus and Q&A with student ambassadors who are currently studying at the University of Manchester which students all found very informative.

The students attended five tutorials about aerospace composites and were set the task of writing a 2000 word essay as the final assignment. All students rose to the challenge, with 50% achieving a 2:1 or a First.

The Brilliant Club gave the students an insight into what it would be like studying at university and finished with an online graduation event and we held a celebratory lunch to recognise individual student achievements. Well done everyone.
