

We are all more and more concerned with the safety of young people online - especially when they use social media and are gaming.

The Grange Academy has teamed up with Digital Awareness UK to provide a webinar for parents and carers on Monday 14th June at 6.00pm on the dangers of these online tools and to give strategies for parents to keep their children safe.

ATTENDANCE

We would like to send a huge congratulation to all students for recording the school's best attendance for over 5 years at 94.4%. This gives students the best opportunity to succeed both academically and with key character and social skills.

To improve this further we have analysed patterns of absence and noted that many students are absent on a Friday. This is not acceptable and absences on Fridays for all students will be monitored and medical evidence requested where persistent patterns are identified.

Please can you ensure that your child is present every day for every minute where possible.

STUDENT COUNCIL

This week it was great to meet with the Student Voice. They discussed the changes that they would like to see at the school post-COVID and selected the charities that they would like to raise money for during the remainder of the year.

In the next six weeks, several events will take place through the House system to try to raise £1000 - this is the ambitious target they have set themselves for the end of term!

SAFETY

It has been great to receive some positive feedback from members of the public regarding students now riding to school wearing helmets. Please remember that this is now part of the school's expectations. We strongly encourage students to walk and ride to school wherever possible but this must be in a safe way.

Any students riding bikes to school without a helmet will have their bikes locked up until parents contact us to give reassurance that safety helmets are being worn.

UNIFORM

Students should be wearing full school uniform or PE kit from the moment that they leave the house in the morning until they return in the evening. If a student brings into school a non-uniform item such as a hoodie this will be confiscated for two weeks as per the school's uniform guidance document.

FIDGET TOYS

We have seen an increase in students, particularly in the lower year groups, bringing fidget toys into the academy. These toys are causing a distraction in lessons. Examples of these toys include fidget poppers, spinners and octopuses.

Unless authorised by the SENDCO, from Monday 14 June 2021, these items will be confiscated. If you have any questions please contact your child's Form Tutor or Head of Year.
