Attendance

We are delighted that our Attendance continues to improve, currently sitting at 94.5%. This is significantly higher than previously and shows the resilience, drive and motivation that students have to attend school. Despite this we still want to be better and to be excellent we need to be over 96%.

Did you know?

Students with over 96% attendance have an 80% chance of passing their GCSE's in Year 11 achieving level 5 or higher in the majority of their assessments. Compare this to only 18% of students achieving the same grades when their attendance drops below 85%!

Uniform

We are really pleased that students have returned to the academy after the Easter holidays looking very smart and well equipped for studies. Some students need a reminder that make up and jewellery are not part of the uniform apart from a wristwatch and a single stud earring in each ear. Please remind your child and help them to adhere to the uniform rules.

We also recognise that some students may have use of an electric scooter at home. Currently, the only place a privately owned e-scooter can be used is on private land. We consider that e-scooters can be dangerous and therefore they are prohibited from being brought onto the school site. Should a student bring an e-scooter to school, it will be confiscated for two weeks in line with other banned items.

Upcoming Assessments for Year 11 and Year 13 Teacher Assessed Grades (TAGs)

The summer exam season is always a stressful time, and we appreciate that the pandemic continues to create additional challenges for both students and staff.

Parents/Carers, and Students of Year 11 and Year 13 should refer to the letter sent out earlier this week. This letter contains more detailed information regarding the upcoming assessments which will help teachers produce the 'TAG' (Teacher Assessed Grade), but in the meantime here is a short summary:

- Teachers will assess students against a national standard, which will be defined by the examination boards before the Easter break.
- Departments will submit grades which will be **quality assured by the school**. This internal quality assurance process will have to be signed off by the examination board to ensure it is rigorous and in line with national standards.
- The school's grades will be **quality assured externally** by the examination boards, which may include random sampling of our school's evidence.
- If the examination boards are confident in our submitted results, then the examination boards will award students their final grades.
- If students do not think their results are accurate, they will have the right to **appeal**. Details will be included in the results envelope / email.

House News

Next week we are delighted to announce the new Student House Captains and House Competitions for the Summer Term. Over 100 students have formally applied to be a House Captain and take an important leadership role within the school.

Events already planned include: The Great Times Table Challenge, The Grange Bake Off, Mixed Rounders, Monologue Writing competition, The Wind Up Car Challenge and a Cultural Experience with the Modern Languages department.

Lateral Flow Tests

Following the latest Government guidelines, please continue to support and encourage your child to take a lateral flow test twice a week at home, three to five days apart. You do not need to notify the academy **unless the test result is positive.** However, please report every result through the track and trace website - <u>https://www.gov.uk/report-covid19-result</u>.

Test and Trace payment for parents

The Department for Education has announced that parents and carers of children who have been advised to self-isolate by their education setting or by NHS Test and Trace, are now able to apply for a Test and Trace Support Payment or discretionary payment of £500, if they meet the eligibility criteria (which includes receipt of certain low-income benefits).

The extension of the Test and Trace Support Payment scheme, which is administered by district and borough councils in Hertfordshire (and ends on Wednesday 30th June) ensures that parents receive some financial support if they are unable to attend work due to childcare responsibilities and are unable to work from home.
