It has been a long and demanding year for students, parents and staff alike and I would like to pay tribute to all of you, particularly to those pupils and teachers involved in sitting and marking assessments for GCSE and A level – your efforts have been heroic in very difficult circumstances. The distance learning on Google Classroom during the second lockdown went very well in the spring term, as did the remote parental evenings and we have all made huge strides in using remote technology.

You will shortly be receiving a detailed email, but I can confirm that School will be closing at 12noon on Thursday 22 July, the last day of term for all pupils, with reception closing at 12.30pm. Students with FSM will be able to use their allowance at break time. Our Student Council have selected Cancer Research as our school charity for this term and we will be having a non-uniform day on that last day of term: please would your son or daughter bring in £1 to contribute on the door to this very deserving cause.

We will be emailing, too, regarding the September return to school, following the recent DfE statement on the corona virus. The return to school will be staggered again to enable initial lateral flow tests to take place. After these initial tests lateral flow tests will continue to be done at home with kits which will be provided. From 19 July onwards NHS England rather than schools will assume responsibility for track and trace.

On Wednesday, our Year 10 English students were treated to fantastic performances of Shakespeare's *Macbeth* and J.B. Priestley's *An Inspector Calls* by The Globe Players. Their responses in the accompanying workshop showed a real depth of engagement and it was wonderful for them to be able to experience a live theatrical performance after such a long hiatus.

We are looking forward to a keenly contested sports week next week in Year Group Competitions. Please note that students will need to come in full PE Kit on the relevant day for their year group.

For those families with children eligible for free school meals, Hertfordshire County Council are offering sporting Holiday Camps with the added benefit of a free meal every day. Full details are at the end of this newsletter.

#### THE GLOBE PLAYERS

Year 10 welcomed The Globe Theatre Company to The Grange who performed for the students Shakespeare's Macbeth and An Inspector Calls by J.B. Priestley.

Seated surrounding the stage, students saw Macbeth come to life, as the actors brought out the true nature of the witches and Lady Macbeth as they plotted and planned a future based on ambition and power.

In between scenes the actors touched on the themes and context of the play, allowing the audience a greater understanding of Shakespeare's purpose and intent in regards to his audience and message. With only a limited number of actors and props, as well as no scenery, pupils were able to experience first hand how a theatre production at that time would have been performed, allowing them to focus on the dialogue and actors themselves.

After a short break, the actors performed the modern play An Inspector Calls. Once again the actors captured the essence of Priestley's message, bringing to life the words on the page and encapsulating the tension within this dramatic play. With a simplistic set and duality of multiple characters, the Globe Theatre Company recreated the elegance and wealth of the aristocratic society from the early 1900s. We witnessed the true intensity of family relationships in a crisis, and the attitudes which accompanied the rejection of moral and social responsibility.

At the end of each performance, the actors ran a Q&A session for students who drilled the performers about the play and the characters themselves. The actors not only provided responses based on their own interpretations and understanding of the individual characters they portrayed, but also about how the plays are relevant to society today and how we can learn from the message each playwright intended to be delivered with each performance.

Overall it was a thoroughly enjoyable experience for students and the staff, bringing to life the plays being studied for the GCSEs next year.
