Attendance News

This term students have continued to come to school despite some challenging circumstances.

Our current attendance figure stands at 93.1% which is over 2% higher than the national average. Our expectations, though, are high and we want this figure nearer 95%. It is proven that students with high attendance have an 82% chance of achieving good GCSE grades. This drops to only 18% when attendance drops near 80%.

Every day counts and students should strive to be in school every day from January.

Huge congratulations to the 205 students who are still part of the 100% club - this means they have not missed one day from school since September.



PSHE Update (Personal Social Health Education)

This term has been a busy term for our students and our PSHE programme. PSHE is a statutory aspect of your child's school curriculum- it also provides students with a wide range of topics to consider and discuss. This also works alongside our cultural capital programme, where students have the opportunity to vote weekly on a topic that affects us all. This term we have considered a range of topics in PSHE and RSE sessions such as Marriage, Conspiracy, Homophobia, Transitions in life, Communities, Consent, Alcohol and body changes and understanding Parliament. We have voted on the following topics this term:

Student Voice

This term the Student Voice has completed a variety of tasks to improve the school and create improved links with community users. Below is just a summary of their impact so far.

Charity Work - this term we have raised £2,200 for Children in Need and Herts Young Homeless. This was through a non-uniform day, an incredible bake sale which raised £500 and Christmas Jumper day. This makes a great start towards our target of raising £10,000 by the end of the academic year.



Kindness - as part of our Character work to be kind, students donated over 700 food items for the local Food Bank in Watford - the photo above shows the fantastic array of foods that will help vulnerable community users over the Christmas break. Staff and students also donated mountains of clothes which are being distributed to local charity shops in the New Year.

Peer on Peer Abuse - all tutor groups contributed towards a "Student Charter" which clarifies how the students at The Grange want us to approach Peer on Peer Abuse as a community. The Student Voice have refined over 150 initial ideas into a supportive and inclusive Charter that will be published in the New Year.
