School Uniform Policy

Aims

- To ensure pupils wear school uniform in order to support positive behaviour and discipline, to develop the school ethos and to support effective teaching and learning.
- To ensure school uniform is affordable and will never be a burden for parents or a barrier to pupils accessing education.
- To ensure compliance with all relevant legislation connected to this policy.

After consultation with all stakeholders our school uniform plays an important part in:

- promoting a sense of pride in the school;
- promoting a sense of community and belonging towards the school;
- promoting equality;
- supporting health and safety;
- setting an appropriate tone for education; and
- creating a common identity amongst pupils regardless of background and therefore acting as a social leveller

Role of the Governing Body

The Governing Body has:

- delegated to the Principal the responsibility of implementing and maintaining this policy;
- delegated powers and responsibilities to the Principal to ensure all school personnel and visitors to the school are aware of and comply with this policy;
- responsibility for ensuring that the school complies with all equalities legislation;
- responsibility for ensuring funding is in place to support this policy;
- responsibility for ensuring this policy is maintained and updated regularly and is accessible;
- responsibility for the effective implementation, monitoring and evaluation of this policy.

Role of the Principal

The Principal will:

Role of Parents/Carers

Parents/carers will:

- be aware of and comply with this policy by ensuring their children wear school uniform at all times;
- liaise with the school where additional guidance and support are required with uniform;
- be asked to take part in periodic surveys conducted by the school.

Role of Students

Pupils will:

- be aware of and comply with this policy by wearing correct uniform;
- liaise with the school council about any improvements to this policy;

Students must follow the uniform code at all times when on the Academy site. This applies throughout the Academy day as well as before and after the Academy day whilst students travel to and from school and home. Branded academy uniform must be purchased from the uniform suppliers. Other items that are not branded can be purchased elsewhere. Consideration will be given to students that cannot wear certain items for SEND or medical reasons provided a professional medical letter is provided.

Students arriving on-site that are out of uniform will be issued with uniform they may borrow. They will also be required to attend a detention at the end of the day for 40 minutes. Students who refuse to wear borrowed uniform will asked in liaison with their parents to correct the uniform or be placed in Internal Exclusion until their uniform meets the expectations and requirements of the academy and this policy.

Uniform Confiscation

If a student is wearing any unacceptable items, (s)he will be expected to remove it immediately. The item(s) will be confiscated and will be returned at the end of the school day. If the item is bought to school for a second time the item will be confiscated for a week and parents/carers informed.

Appendix 1 – Shoe guidance - Acceptable and Unacceptable

Please note that even though shoes may be sold in the 'school's section' in shops and online these may not be within our guidance as what is acceptable.

Acceptable Styles		Unacceptable styles
	Velcro shoes are acceptable, but they should be in a shoe, rather than a trainer style.	
	The soles should be generally smooth sided, rather than with detailed patterning and indentations which is typically of trainers. The material should be plain with minimal panels, rather than the stitching and detail which is found on a trainer.	
	Girls' shoes should not have a heel more than one inch.	
	The shoe material should be smooth or with minimal patterns such as Brogue style shoes.	
	Detailed patterning and changes in material are more of a trainer style and are not allowed.	
	Fabric, canvas and aerated fabric are not allowed and shoes with a heel loop are also not allowed.	





Lace up shoes should not look like a trainer style shoe. Very rounded toes and trainer style soles suggest a trainer, rather than a shoe and are not allowed.

Thicker, round lace styles also suggest a trainer style which is not allowed.
