Dear Parent/Carer

Re: Student Return to School – Year 11

We would like to congratulate students at The Grange Academy for their resilience, hard work, and commitment towards their learning following the latest period of lockdown. The engagement and participation with the remote Live teaching has impressed everyone at the school and we are proud of the progress made by all students in this difficult and challenging time.

Nevertheless, face-to-face teaching and learning will always be at the core of everything we do, so we are very much looking forward to welcoming back our students during the week beginning Monday 8th March 2021. We are now taking steps to prepare the academy and it is vitally important that all parents read this letter carefully, enabling them to fully support their child in their return to school.

1/ Student staggered return to the Academy

On **Friday 5th March** we are coordinating a staff **Inset Day** to prepare for the return of students the following week. On this day students will be set academic learning tasks on Google Classroom for the lessons on their timetable. There will be no remote LIVE lessons on this day.

From Monday 8th March students will return to school on the following dates:

2/ Asymptomatic Testing

We strongly recommend that all academy students complete a Lateral Flow Test prior to their return to the Academy. Thank you to the high percentage of parents that have already given consent for their child to have this. Students who consent will be tested three times before the Easter holiday and will need to have a negative result each time before they return to lessons.

All Year 11 students must arrive at school through the **Main Entrance** on the following dates and times in full school uniform to complete their first Lateral Flow Test. Students without consent for the test should still arrive at this time.

3/ COVID 19 Safety and Control Measures

When we return there will be strict COVID-19 restrictions and expectations in place regarding how the Academy can operate. Please read the points below carefully with your child before they return to school:

- Apart from the first day back when students will enter via the Main Reception, Year Groups will continue to arrive and leave school at different times and entrances to maximise social distancing during their journeys to and from school:

- Year Groups will be in “bubbles” and will not mix with other year groups
- Students should still attend school in their PE Kit on days when they have PE on their timetable

- Students will be required to **wear a mask at all times whilst in the school building** - this includes in lessons. The only exceptions to this are whilst eating in the restaurant or whilst outside at break and lunchtime.

Students who are not wearing a mask in the school building will spend a period of time in Internal Exclusion.

Any student that is exempt from wearing a mask must have written medical evidence to support this.

- Students will be required to clean their hands when they arrive and regularly throughout the day.
- Year groups will have their own toilets and areas for break and lunch
- Students must not attend the academy if they have any symptoms of COVID-19: a high temperature, a new continuous cough; and/or a loss or change to their sense of taste and smell
- We encourage students not to travel to the academy by public transport. If there is no alternative they must wear a face covering.

4/ School Uniform & Equipment

Please ensure that your child returns to the academy in the correct uniform, including school shoes and their school bag. It is very important that your child starts back on a positive note.

Parents should note that any student returning in March without the correct uniform will be sent home so that the issue can be rectified. No allowances will be made for any unacceptable items of uniform (this includes PE Kit).

The Uniform and Equipment procedures are comprehensive documents and are available on the school website.

Final Thoughts

We know that this has been a hugely challenging time for everyone and we are very conscious of the long-term impact on student mental health and well-being. We are confident, however, that we will be able to put a strong 'recovery' programme in place for all students, which will include opportunities for sport and activities after school, so please watch this space. The very act of returning to attending full-time schooling is a hugely significant first step in that recovery.

Following the DfE announcement yesterday, we will shortly be giving further clarification about the arrangements in place for producing Teacher Assessed Grades for every student at The Grange. We remain confident that students will get the grades they deserve and the reward for their continuing hard work.
